10. **Condition of body**—Whether well-nourished, thin or emaciated, warm or cold.

Body was separated in two parts—  
directly caused injury below the  
thoracic cavity upto the pelvic  
cavity

1) Abrasion on left thigh 25 x 12 cm

2) Abrasion on back 20 x 18 cm.

Injuries can be within 4 five  
hours before.

If bruises be present what is  
the condition of the  
subcutaneous tissues?

It can be caused by hand  
or blunt object.
