7. Sex, apparent age, race or caste.

8. **Condition of the clothes—** Whether wet with water, stained with blood or soiled with vomit or faecal matter.

9. Special marks on the skin such as scars, tattooing etc., any malformations peculiarities, or other marks of identification. State of the teeth.

In newly born infants, the length and (if possible), the weight of the body to be recorded together with the state of the hair, nails and umbilical cord, its length, whether placenta is attached or not, if present, its size and condition.

11. **Rigor Mortis**—Well-marked,  
slight or absent; whether  
present in the whole body or  
part only.

12. Extent and signs of decom-  
position, presence post-  
mortem lividity of buttocks,  
loins, back and thighs or any  
other part. Whether bullae  
present and the nature of  
their contained fluid.  
Condition of the cuticle.

13. **Features**—Whether natural  
or swollen, state of eyes,  
position of tongue; nature of  
fluid (if any) oozing from  
mouth, nostrils or ears.

14. **Condition of skin**—Marks  
of blood etc. In suspected  
drowning the presence or  
absence of cutis anserina  
to be noted.

15. Injuries to external genitals  
Indication of purging

- No injury to external genitalia.

16. Position of limbs—  
Especially of arms and  
of fingers in suspected  
drowning the presence or  
absence of sand or earth  
within the nails or on the  
skin of hands and feet.

- No suspect of drowning.

17. Surface wounds and  
injuries—Their nature, posi-  
tion, dimensions (measured)  
and directions to be  
accurately stated—their  
probable age and causes  
to be noted.

- Abression over cheek Lt - 5x2cm

- Abression left thigh front! 2x1cm

- Abression Rt. Thigh. 3x3.

- Fracture of Rt Hip joint.  
Dislocation of femoral head,  
from Hip.

- Swelling of thigh right 15x15cm
