

III. Internal Examination—

19. Head—

(i) Injuries under the scalp, their nature.

No under scalp haem

(ii) Skull—Vault and base—describe fractures, their sites, dimensions, directions, etc.

Skull vault & base intact

(iii) Brain—The appearance of its coverings, size, weight and general condition of the organ itself and any abnormality found in its examination to be carefully noted (weight M: 3 grams F: 2.75 grams).

Meninges - Intact, 1
Brain - Intact

20. Thorax—

(a) Walls, ribs, cartilages

2nd to 9th ribs fractured anteriorly on both right & left side. Extravasation of blood present in surrounding tissues.

(b) Pleura

Torn corresponding to fractured ribs. About 300 ml blood & blood clots present in pleural cavity.

(c) Larynx, Trachea and Bronchi

Intact, no foreign body, mucosa pale

(d) Right Lung

Laceration present over anterior aspect of upper lobe of size 5cm x 3cm x 2cm. Contusion present over anterior aspect of lower lobe

(e) Left Lung

Laceration present over anterior of upper lobe 5cm x 2cm red. of size 4cm x 2cm x 2cm. Contusion present over anterior aspect 3cm x 2cm red.

(f) Pericardium

Intact

(g) Heart with weight

Laceration present over left side of ventricle of size 2cm x 2cm x epicardial muscle deep

(h) Large vessels

Intact contains blood & blood clots
